

THE ROLE OF PRIMARY SCHOOL PRINCIPALS IN THE MANAGEMENT OF TEACHING AND LEARNING WITHIN VHEMBE DISTRICT IN LIMPOPO PROVINCE

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ABSTRACT

The study investigated the role of primary school principals as managers of teaching and learning within Vhembe District of the Limpopo Province. The study was informed by the theory of distributed leadership. Distributed leadership theory is a specific type of participatory leadership, commonly described as creating an environment where the ownership of decisions and answerability is distributed among all constituents of the organisation.

The study adopted the qualitative research approach. Focused group interviews used to collect data. The interviews were punctuated by probing as a way of gaining more information pertaining to the role of school principals as managers of teaching and learning. Fourty seven (47) school principals and deputy principals constituted the sample.

Both the review of the literature and empirical investigation suggested that student learning required concerted efforts of all teachers within the school set up, the principal, and administrators working in harmony with each other and with learners.
